

His interest and current area of work is livelihood, community building, good governance, organic farming, environmental strategy development, growth and women empowerment linking with sustainable development goals.

Mrs. Lokanayagi, a social entrepreneur, working with Sathi MRITE project, Dharmapuri, she is a social entrepreneur who promotes the eco-friendly products, to avoid polluting the environment she also promotes organic farming and bamboo water bottle making.

On 14th March, 2023, third session was dealt by Mrs. Lokanayagi, a social entrepreneur on "Issues and Challenges of Social Entrepreneur".

The resource person has mentioned the seriousness of the increasing usage of the plastics in the present conditions and its harmful effects on our environment, it seems like the world would not function properly without plastics.

She has raised an intriguing question asking that is it practically possible to create a plastic free environment?

And suggested everyone should follow and should have the personal discipline to reduce the usage of plastic's, she promoted the usage of Bamboo products which is eco-friendly and it doesn't affect the environment as plastic does.

Through his effective and efficient interventions, he has attracted so many young people into the field of NGO. On 15th March, 2023 the fourth session was dealt by Mr. V. Kennady, is the secretary and director, Jayam community resource centre society, on "Role of NGO on Sustainable development".

The resource person has provided wider knowledge about the difference between the Social Entrepreneur and the other corporates. The Social entrepreneur cares about the welfare of the community, focuses on the people who are struggled for their basic needs and for their upliftment whereas the corporates are self – centred and focuses on businessmen and rich people.
